An Unambiguous Command

Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.

Romans 12:12

[The disciples and others with them] with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer....

Acts 1:14

And [the first church] devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Acts 2:42

Now Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer....

Acts 3:1

An Undeniable Pattern ...[Peter, John and their friends] lifted their voices together to God....And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness. Acts 4:23-31

But we [the apostles] will devote ourselves to *prayer* and to the ministry of the word.

Acts 6:4

An Undeniable Pattern And as they were stoning Stephen, he called out, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." And falling to his knees he cried out with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against [my opponents...the High Priest and council]..." And when he had said this, he fell asleep. cts 7:59-60

Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent to them Peter and John, who came down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit.... Acts 8:14-15

An Undeniable Pattern But Peter put [the saints and widows] outside, and knelt down and prayed; and turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. And he gave her his hand and raised her up. Then, calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive. Acts 9:40-41

...Cornelius...*prayed* continually to God....Peter went up on the housetop about the sixth hour to *pray*.

Acts 10:1-9

So Peter was kept in prison, but earnest prayer for him was made to God by the church.

Acts 12:5

When [Peter] realized this, he went to the house of Mary, the mother of John whose other name was Mark, where many were gathered together and were praying. Acts 12:12

Then after fasting and *praying* [the teachers and prophets in the Antioch church] laid their hands on [Paul and Barnabas] and sent them off.

Acts 13:3

And when [Paul and Barnabas] had appointed elders for [the new disciples] in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they had believed. Acts 14:23

And on the Sabbath day [Paul and his companions] went outside the gate to the riverside, where [they] supposed there was a place of prayer, and [they] sat down and spoke to the women who had come together. Acts 16:13

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them....

Acts 16:25

And when [Paul] had said these things, he knelt down and *prayed* with [the elders of the Ephesian church].

Acts 20:36

And kneeling down on the beach, [the disciples from Tyre along with Paul and his companions] prayed and said farewell to one another.

Acts 21:5b-6a

It happened that the father of Publius lay sick with fever and dysentery. And Paul visited him and *prayed*, and putting his hands on him, healed him.

Acts 28:8

An Unrelenting Call

Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving. At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the word, to declare the mystery of Christ, on account of which I am in prison — that I may make it clear, which is how I ought to speak.
